Introducing UHCW




- One of the busiest teaching hospitals in the country

Inclusive of all activations



Background

- Within our Trust, we identified aspects of management of massive haemorrhages that could be improved
- SHOT report 2016 identified delays in transfusion in cases of massive haemorrhage as causes of mortality

 The Massive Haemorrhage Protocol (MHP) at UHCW was updated in 2016



What we did

We designed a demonstration video of management of massive haemorrhage

And here it is.....





What we did next

 The video was shown to post-Finals medical students at Warwick Medical School along with a short talk regarding Trust policies

- A short quiz was administered to assess students' knowledge before and after viewing the video
- Topics covered in the quiz: how to activate and stand down the MHP, blood product ratios, team roles within an MHP



What we found

- 57 quizzes were fully completed
- Average scores increased from 2.93 (pre-video) to 6.12 (post-quiz) out of a maximum of 7 marks available

- Medical students' knowledge increased following the video
- However, the true test will be change in clinical practice
- We have made the video available via the Trust intranet for staff to access
- The video will also be used as part of mandatory blood transfusion training
