- Founded in 2003 by Christine Mills
- EKHUFT MCU is sponsored by Gloria Hunniford whose Daughter Caron Keating died of cancer in 2004
- 'Caron' launched in 2014
- Dedicated team of nurses and drivers who go to several sites per week: Ashford, Deal, Dover, Faversham & Herne Bay

2016: Let's have a meeting....



- Instigated by Chemotherapy Matron for EKHUFT, Tracey Rigden and attended by Chief BMS (that's me) & Blood Transfusion Co-Ordinator Angela Green
- How hard could this be?



So let's have a meeting.... How could we refuse!







How hard could this be?



- Patients: must have been transfused before, no special physical requirements eg. blood warmer, maximum 2 units, only one patient to be transfused at a time
- Laboratory: change control, requesting in LIMS, traceability, transport & cold chain, validation of boxes, all staff trained blah blah
- What if.....?



What if....?



- Transfusion Reaction?
- Follow normal EKHUFT transfusion reaction policy & if medic required, call 999



Go Live April 2017!



- Blood on the Bus! (BOB)
- One unit transfused to one patient!
- Now averaging two patients requiring two units per month although the demand increases in the winter
- No adverse reactions or service provision problems... so far!
