MR CHRIS ELLIOTT - BSc, MSc, FIBMS, CSc

I started working in London in 1984 moving through a succession of transfusion and transplantation posts within the capital before moving to manage transfusion at Middlesbrough in 1996 for over 6 years.

I then moved to be manager for the transfusion laboratory services of Leeds and Bradford hospitals for over five years. However in the summer of 2007 I moved back to be Blood Bank Manager (since taken managerial role over all of Haematology, Coagulation and Blood Transfusion) for the South Tees Hospitals which now consists of two hospitals, James Cook University Hospital (JCUH) in Middlesbrough and the Friarage Hospital (FH) in Northallerton. In the last couple of years we have centralised the transfusion testing at JCUH and transformed FH Haematology into a rapid response laboratory maintained by support workers out of hours (authorisation is by BMS at JCUH)I have sat on a number of BCSH guideline writing committees, including pre-compatibility testing and validation, also serving as the BBTS representative on the BCSH transfusion task force for over 8 years (now stood down). I am currently the IBMS representative on the MHRA Blood Consultative Committee and the IBMS specialist advisor for transfusion.

MRS SHARRAN GREY MSc CSci FIBMS Cert Mgmt (Open)

Sharran is a Principal Clinical Scientist and Blood Transfusion Clinical Lead for Bolton NHS Foundation Trust. Her responsibilities involve direct patient care (including contribution to multi-disciplinary specialist clinics), the scientific direction of the transfusion laboratory and the Trust-wide governance of blood transfusion, as well as training and education.

She has recently been appointed to the UK Serious Hazards of Transfusion Working Expert Group. Her current service development projects include the management of anaemia in primary care, and body weight dosing of red cells in normovolaemic anaemia. She is also an associate lecturer at Manchester Metropolitan University. She is undertaking doctoral research in clinical blood transfusion to support a service development project for patients receiving red cells at home.
