Her main interests are haemoglobinopathies and rare inherited anaemias, and in particular the genetic investigation of inherited anaemias, including whole genome sequencing. She is dedicated to using patients' views to guide how research is conducted in haematology and coordinating best practice care in red cell disorders at the European level.

Farrah is the current Chair of the National Haemoglobinopathy Registry and leads the thalassaemia service at the Whittington Hospital. She is also the medical Director for transfusion at NHSBT and the Chair of the UK Forum on Haemoglobin Disorders. Her goal is to improve patient care by providing a more central record for patients health complications in order to ensure that care is provided using the most comprehensive information available through a central registry.
